join us in the commemoration of this very special event.

The Lebanese community has been recognized for its immense contribution to the cultural, economic, and social life in Canada.

A thank you also goes to the representative of the Ontario Premier (Mr. Charles Souza) and of the PC leader (MPP Vic Fedeli). Their participation helped convey the respect of their leaders to our community. WLCU World Council Meeting – Nov 14-18, 2012, NY and NJ

November 14-18,

Not even Hurricane Sandy could stop the WLCU's World Council meeting from happening.

WLCU representatives from all over the globe met in New York over the weekend of November 16th and 17th.

With the World Secretariat General heading the congress, delegates discussed their efforts over the past year, and heard about initiatives being led by Lebanese elsewhere in the world. Canada was proudly represented by WVP Elias Kassab and Regional President François Abou Neeman.

WLCU World President Mr.
Michel Doueihi chaired the
meeting along with World
Secretary General Mr. Toni
Kaddissi, and other
representatives from the world
and the World Youth Council.

Mr. Doueihi reaffirmed our will to serve our home country Lebanon and the immigrants who adhere to the land of our fathers and grandfathers.

He presented a report of the following **achievements**:

- A World Youth conference was held in Lebanon, as well as a world council meeting honouring former minister Michel Edde, President on the Maronite Foundation abroad.
- Cooperated with the Municipality of Dhour Choueir for the election of Miss Expatriates. Miss Patricia Geagea (Sweden) won the title of Beauty Queen.
- Participated in a successful WLCU Youth conference in Argentina

A recurring theme overarched the WP's words: that of the **Youth**. The Youth are believed to be the ones rebuilding the new Lebanon, its culture, ideas and aspirations, and a call for their support was made, including a permanent seat for the Youth at the World Council. Youth will be welcomed and integrated

harmoniously, as we count on them for a brighter future.

The recommendations from the meeting in NY are to hold the following events:

- Conference for the Youth to be held in Lebanon in August with visits to the cities of Lebanese heritage, culture and tourism.
- The finalization of the construction of the library dedicated to Gibran Khalil Gibran and the preparation of the arena honouring the poet in Caracas; and
- The authorization of all councils around the globe to prepare the Miss Immigrant elections



Please watch for more information on the following Lebanese National recommendations:

- His Excellency President Michel Suleiman persisted on giving expatriates the right to vote and exercise their rights and duties as citizens equally to those residing in the country.
- Conferees insisted that any new laws should include a mechanism

coordinated by the ministry of Interior and the ministry of Immigrants to give Lebanese descendants their citizenship rights in order to vote.

In conclusion, conferees wanted to draw the attention of the Lebanese government in general, the Cultural Ministry in particular and the Department of Antiquities to the ongoing destruction of historical homes and

neighborhoods, changing the archeological aspect of the city of Tripoli.

Of note, in celebration of the large influence of the Lebanese community in Mexico, a Souvenir Post Stamp was issued by the government of Mexico. During a dinner honouring the Mexican President at the Lebanese Club, Mr. Felipe Calderon delivered the commemorating post stamp

to the Lebanese Club and the Lebanese Community in that country.
